## RELIGION AND EDUCATION

This year in addition to our continuing sponsorship of the Religious School holiday programs and the support of our Youth Activities Program, we have had some new innovations for our Religious School Committee organization. Our goal this year has been to draw more closely together the parent group and the functionings of our school. Also, we have endeavored to so organize as to offer specific responsibilities to an increased number of chairmen. In the attainment of these goals, we have offered a discussion series for parents entitled, "When Your Child Asks"; we held in conjunction with our school an Open House; we sponsored Opening Day Programs for the parents; and we co-sponsored a workshop for parents of children soon to be Bar and Bat Mitzvah.

We increased the number of people actively involved in our Religious School by drawing a larger form of organization. In this respect we created a Workshop Chairmanship to work with the Religious School in presenting informative programs of interest to parents; we originated three Co-Chairmanships for Religious School Transportation to assist families in arranging transportation to and from our school; we appointed a Religious School Hospitality Chairmanship to develop greater rapport between Sisterhood and our teaching staff.

## UNIONGRAM COMMITTEE

In August at the time when the dues statements were mailed to each member, we enclosed a package of small Uniongrams with each bill, together with a printed note on a sample miniature Uniongram listing our names and phone numbers, so that members could contact us throughout the year for additional Uniongrams as they needed them. Five hundred and sixty-seven packages were mailed at this time.

Uniongram sales for this year are as follows:

The combined total of large and small Uniongram sales was 749 packages or \$749.00, of which \$649.00 was cash receipts and \$100.00 in Uniongrams was used by Sisterhood for various messages throughout the year.

The value of the stock on hand to date is \$272.00

Sales were somewhat less this year, and we urge our members to support the Uniongram program, as its purpose is to supplement contributions to the Youth, Education and Sisterhood Fund, which aids eligible students of the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, development of the Sisterhood program, and youth activities of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations. Also, Uniongrams are an exceptionally thoughtful method of remembering someone on various occasions.

The practice of sending the small Uniongrams with the dues statements is excellent, as it is our largest sale of the year, and the number returned or not paid for is minimal.
